Language Requirements	Neither does PUC-Rio require for international students to have any level of knowledge of the Portuguese language, nor to present any certificates of proficiency prior to their arrival. Nonetheless, all the exchange students are required to take a <i>Portuguese as a Second Language</i> classes during the regular academic term. On the first day of classes they must take a placement test in order to place them into correct Portuguese levels. Exchange students also have the opportunity to take an Intensive Portuguese as a Second Language course before the regular semester begins, although this course is not mandatory.

Grading System	Grades range from minimum 0 (zero) to maximum 10 (ten). 5 (five) is the minimum passing grade for undergraduate students and 6 (six) for graduate students.	
Credits System	1 credit = 1 class hour/week of lecture class or 2 hours laboratory class/week or 3 hours of exercise class/week, considered standard term of 15 weeks.
